

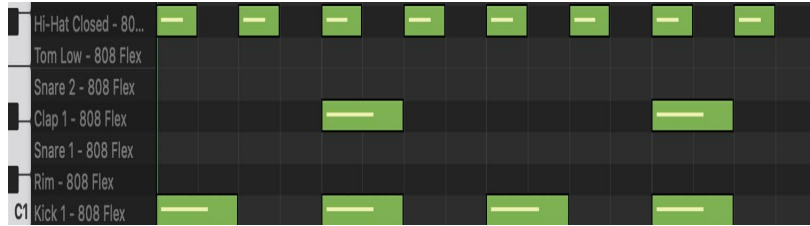
5 ESSENTIAL EDM DRUM PATTERNS

EDM Drum Patterns for Your Next Track!



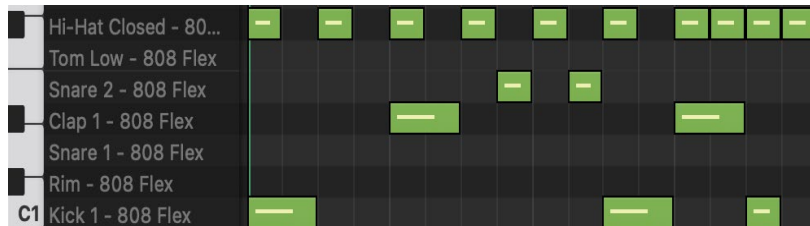
1. Four-on-the-Floor:

This is a fundamental beat with a kick drum on every downbeat (1, 2, 3, 4) and snare/clap on the offbeats.



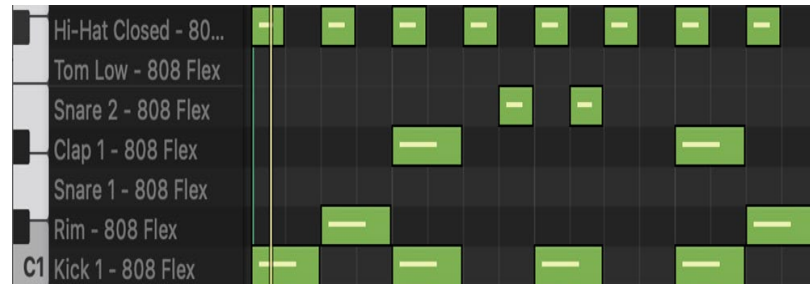
2. Breakbeat:

Alternates between a kick and snare pattern, giving a syncopated and dynamic feel. It's often used in genres like breakbeat and jungle.



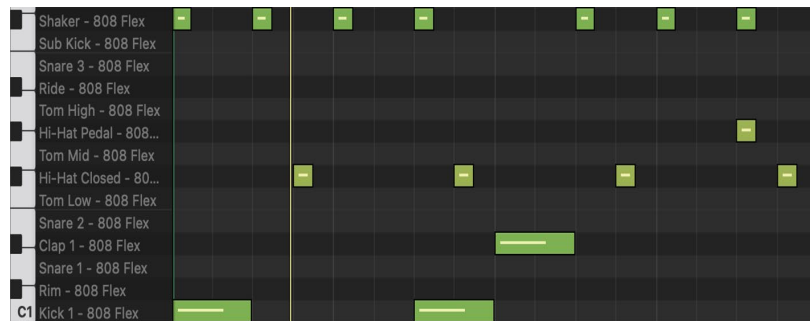
3. House Beat:

Features a four-on-the-floor kick pattern, with a hi-hat playing a steady eighth-note rhythm and additional percussion elements like shakers or added snare/clap textures.



4. Dubstep Beat:

Known for its syncopated and half-time feel, with a heavy emphasis on powerful and distorted kick and snare hits. It often includes intricate percussion elements and fills.



5. Garage Beat:

A garage drum beat, commonly found in UK Garage music, features a two-step pattern with a syncopated rhythm. It includes shuffling hi-hats, a strong bassline, and often incorporates vocal samples, contributing to its signature swing, groove, and danceability.
